

1. Washington Square Park

74 Broad Street

Originally known as City Green Park. It was rededicated to commemorate George Washington's 100th year anniversary of the Battle of Yorktown.

3. Chalmers Street

The longest cobblestone street in Charleston. The cobblestones are ballast stones for ships, needed to weigh down during journies to Charleston. Dr. Chalmers was the first scientist in America to conduct scientific weather experiences.

2. South Carolina Historical Archives

100 Meeting Street

The first fireproof building in the United States. This building was designed by Robert Mills, architect of the Washington Monument.

4. Exchange and Provost

122 East Bay Street

The last building in the American Colonies that was built with British money. During the Revolutionary War the Provost Dungeon held patriots prisoner.
