1. Dock Street Theatre

135 Church Street

Known for being the first theatre set up in the U.S., solely for theatrical performances. Previously a hotel named the Planter's, famous for Planter's Punch.

3. Pirate's Courtyard

141 Church Street

Supposedly the location of the old Pirates Tavern, this courtyard brought pirates throughout the Carolina coast, including the famous "Blackbeard".

2. St. Philip's Episcopal

142 Church Street

The oldest Church congregation in historic Charleston, Vice President of the U.S. John C. Calhoun, and the famed Edward Rutledge were both buried here.

4. Philadelphia Alley

25 Cumberland Street

Constructed in 1766 from bricks given to the city by Philadelphia after one of Charleston's major fires. Also, many duels to settle disputes took place here.
